

Whole families have been wiped out, thousands are dying from their

wounds while thousands of others are starving, forced to consume animal feed and water mixed with sewage.

As you read this, 1.5 million Palestinians, having made their way south under constant attack, are sheltering in the city of Rafah at Gaza's southern border. They have nowhere left to flee, the Egyptian border is closed to them, and the Israeli authorities are seeing to it that virtually no medical or food assistance can reach them. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has announced that an attack on Rafah to destroy the remnants of Hamas is imminent and will not be delayed even if there's a temporary pause in killing to exchange hostages for Palestinian prisoners.

While Israelis are focused on the release of the hostages and the destruction of Hamas, a worldwide consensus, including in the United States, is growing for a permanent ceasefire. Millions of brave working people and students have taken to the streets on behalf of the Palestinians. Pro-Israel organizations like American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPEC) and the Anti-Defamation Leage (ADL) are furious, threatening to defund colleges and universities that won't discipline pro-Palestinian students and to derail the careers of politicians brave enough to challenge US support for Israel.
